

NINE YPC's RECEIVE CLUB ROOMS FROM C.A. FOR BLOCK ACTIVITIES

Girl, Boy Scouts, Hi-Y Assigned Space;
Six Other Clubs Make Formal Application

With nine clubs, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, and the Hi-Y already assigned their space, furniture and a variety of table games, the project of Community Activities to provide each block with a club room has taken definite steps forward, J. Wesley Johnstone, CA supervisor, said this week.

Block clubs that have received official permission and need only to set up their rooms are Blks. 14, 37, 34, 26, 21, 31, 12 and 7. Blks. 30, 15, 41, 19, 5 and 22 have made requests and steps are now being taken to provide them with the necessary equipment.

Although most of the furniture will go to block clubs with a mixed membership, it will be possible for individual organizations to receive a club room of their own, providing they go through the regular procedure.

Clubs must fill out a "Club Formation Request," obtained through the CA office, answering questions pertaining to type of club, program, age level, etc.

On the "Application for Use of Community Space," definite approval must be given by the Block Commissioner. In an event that a vacant apartment is used, the signature of the neighbor or neighbors must be obtained.

In an agreement with the CA, the group will be held responsible for the conduct of its members while using the space and for general cleaning and condition of the room; for a weekly program report; and for the sharing of space with other groups when necessary.

The Community Activities stand ready to give any advice and assistance at any time, it was said.
